Tournament Rules:

1. Players will start with 25,000 in tournament chips.
2. Levels will last 30 minutes each. This is a one-day tournament.
3. On-site registration and unlimited re-entries available until the start of level 9.
4. Entries purchased prior to the start of the tournament will be considered live and in play. Alternates and late entries purchased after the start of the tournament will have no obligation and will not be live until the player has been dealt in. Alternates and late entries may have to wait for a seating assignment. Alternates not sat during the registration period will be entitled to a refund.
5. This tournament is played in big blind ante format. A single ante will be owed from the big blind in the amount of the blind level each hand. The big blind is paid before the ante.
6. Management reserves the right to alter, change or cancel this tournament. Management will not be held responsible in the event of typographical errors or misinformation on websites or printed materials and players will have no claim in these matters.
7. Any unauthorized chips introduced into tournament play will be immediately removed upon detection without substitution. Any parties determined to be responsible of the foreign chips will be disqualified with no refund. It is all tournament players' responsibility to bring to management's attention unusual chips, circumstances, or irregularities.
8. Residents of foreign countries without a U.S. tax treaty will be subject to tax withholdings.
9. Tournament entries are non-transferable and non-refundable. Entries won through Poker Room promotions into this tournament are non-transferable and non-refundable.
10. This tournament will be played 8 handed.
11. Redraw at 16 and 9 players or at tournament director's discretion.
12. This is a bounty tournament.
13. \$698 entry fee will be used to fund the prize pool of which \$200 will go towards the player bounty. \$102 is the registration fee of which \$30 will go towards staffing fees and \$2 will go towards the promotional fund for the SHRPO Tournament Leaderboard.
14. This tournament uses Pay Chart A.
15. **Progressive Bounty Rules:** The Tournament will reward participants for eliminating another player (the "Bounty"). Each player who eliminates a Bounty from the Tournament will receive a prize (as outlined below) from the Bounty prize pool.
Players are responsible for keeping their own Bounty chips visible and on the table at all times during their Tournament play. A player who misplaces or loses their assigned Bounty chips will be required to replace them at their own expense. Failure to follow this rule may result in penalty, up to and including disqualification and forfeiture of Tournament and Bounty chips.
When a player is eliminated from the Tournament, the winner(s) of that hand will be awarded all Bounty chips in possession of that eliminated player(s). Bounty chips of multiple eliminated players will be combined prior to being divided among the winner(s).
Bounty chips are only to be used for purposes of the Bounty prize pool in this Tournament and will only be exchanged for a live poker chip as outlined below.
Bounty chips have no cash value and cannot otherwise be exchanged or substituted. Each Bounty chip is assigned a value of \$25.
If a single winner eliminates a player(s), the Bounty chips from the eliminated player(s) will be divided in half by the dealer and one-half (1/2) of these Bounty chips will be exchanged, one-for-one, for a live casino chip valued at \$25. The remaining half of the Bounty chips from the eliminated player will be added to the winning player's Bounty chip stack. If a player is eliminated with an odd number of Bounty chips, the "odd" Bounty chip will be added to the winning player's stack of Bounty chips.
In the event multiple players eliminate a Bounty with the same winning hand, all players with a Tournament chip count equal to or greater than the Bounty prior to the start of the hand will receive an equally split portion of the Bounty chips of the eliminated player(s) prior to the dealer splitting and exchanging the Bounty chips as outlined above for each individual winner.
If there are insufficient Bounty chips to supply each winner with an even amount, the "odd" Bounty chip(s) will be awarded beginning with the player in the worst position (the first player left of the dealer button). If there are insufficient Bounty chips to supply each winner with a single Bounty chip, the Bounty chips will be awarded, one at a time, beginning with the player in the worst position (the player who acted first during the play of the hand).
Bounty chips will only be redeemed for live casino chips at the table by a Tournament supervisor immediately after the Bounty is earned. Bounty chips will not be permitted to be redeemed at any other time.
Removal of Bounty chips from the table or any attempt to manipulate or circumvent the Bounty chip exchange may result in penalty, up to and including disqualification.
